WELCOME FROM HOST PASTOR

TE Wayne Morrow

Wayne Morrow welcomed all in attendance to the Desert Hills Presbyterian Community Church. He stated that the church was started in 1996 and introduced Jacque Lyman, wife of the first Pastor at Desert Hills, who was in attendance. Clyde Grabski, the Music Director at Desert Hills was introduced to those in attendance. Pastor Wayne Morrow also invited all present to retire to the Sanctuary at the close of the meeting to attend the Celebration of Life for Anne Roberts Smith who had passed to the nearer Presence of Our Lord on October 15, 219. Anne was recognized as a long and faithful server of the Presbytery and of Desert Hills Presbyterian Church.

WORSHIP SERVICE

All were invited to congregate in the Sanctuary to worship the Lord. The Message, "Serve in Faith and Grow a Servant's Heart", was presented by Jeff Mague, Presbytery Moderator at Grace Temecula. The choir from Desert Hills sang the anthem *By Bread and Wine* composed by Clyde Grabski, Music Director.

During the worship service, Claire Schlegel and Neal Neuenschwander, the Moderator and Vice-Moderator of the Presbytery, were installed.

VITAL CONGREGATIONS INITIATIVE

Robert Stewart, VCI Coordinator, presented an update on the Initiative. He was introduced to the initiative a little over 2 years ago in Coachella Valley. He said that God is never finished and that in retirement he had the time and energy, so here he is as Coordinator. He grew up in the Presbyterian church, was nurtured and sent off to service. Timm High asked him what he wanted to do, which resulted him going to Denver the Vital Congregations Initiative was introduced. He observed that half the churches being under 100 members, and many under 50 members. New churches were being started, but the unintentional downsizing resulted in more churches that couldn't afford to keep up buildings and doing the services they needed to do. The churches were busy "doing things" instead of being with people. The Presbyterian Mission Agency had kept track of what successful churches had in common, and they found seven characteristics in vital churches. These churches were taking time to care for one another and were welcoming to visitors. They were not being judgmental, offensive or afraid. They recognized that the opposite of fear is trust and that God's faith is sufficient. The initiative focuses the first year on building relationships and sharing the marvelous things God is doing in our midst. Each church is unique. Some are coasting or going downhill that need to be restored to being vital. VCI invites churches to take a look at themselves and evaluate how healthy they are during the first year. They need to face reality and make the effort needed to

change, because self-knowledge is essential to move ahead. The second year is focused on asking how God wants a church to go forward. Churches are asked to look, listen, learn, share and celebrate, as well as to grieve some of their losses. Robert is excited to coordinate the churches efforts. Becky Bane and Sandy Tice will work with him and with the Presbytery staff. They will work with each church to discern God's future for it. He is committed to taking this journey with the churches.

PRESBYTERY COMMISSION REPORT Jeff Mague, Committee/Commission Chair (CC)

The Commission presented one motion for action as reflected on Appendix 2. It recommended that the Presbytery Assembly approve the 2020 budget of \$550,826.40 submitted by PFIFD. **MSP**

Jeff Mague identified TE Andrew Parnell of Rialto as the one to answer questions about the budget. He thanked Andrew and Cherylyn Thornton for preparing the budget before the end of the year and pointed out that the increased budget is a commitment to the future.

PARTNERS IN MINISTRY

The Partners in Ministry Committee had just met the week before and had no written report. It had approved the following grants: \$2,000 to Corona to spruce up its worship space; \$1,500 to North Kirk to start a jazz service; funds to pay part of the cost for Nathan Sobers of Stonewall Ministry who is in the inquiry phase to go to a conference. Paul reported that the wonderful Pastors' Retreat is scheduled for October 26-28, 2020.

Background of Motion Request: On November 20, 2019, Bruce Myers will go to the Arizona Presbyterian Peace Fellowship Action to support Dr. Scott Warren who was arrested and charged with feeding migrants in the desert. Dr. Warren will be on trial for giving compassionate aid by picking up people in the desert whose lives were in jeopardy and taking them to an aid station. The Station was visited by ICE who brought federal charges against Dr. Warren for abetting undocumented immigrants. Bruce would like to go to an interfaith action at the courthouse on behalf of the Presbytery and requests financial support. **MSP** to bless Bruce's presence without providing funding.

Paul reported that the local camp and conference center in Big Bear will almost be lakeside if there is another big rain. A LEAD event is being planned with Eric Law. Erin Thomas talked about the Holy Currencies book and the handout brochure. After a year's research it was realized that mission oriented and sustainable churches have these currencies active in their congregations. This program coincides with the Vital Congregations Initiative.

Property, Finance, Investment and Funds Development

Andrew Parnell (CC)

The Financial report was provided as Appendix 3. The Fontana escrow was to close the following Tuesday for \$929,000, and Presbytery will be carrying the loan. Interest and allocation were reported. There was a request for assistance for Northkirk – money for in-C database will come from the Yucaipa income.

The committee moves to receive September 30 financial statement (presented in Attachment 3A) and file for Review. **MSP** The Committee moved to allow Bethany Presbyterian Church, Rialto to negotiate a relationship with Loving Hearts Child Development Center to rent the Christian Education Building on the Eastern portion of the church property. Loving Hearts will cover all costs of renovation or upgrade to the building. The contract is to stipulate that, should Loving Hearts be unable to fulfill the rental contract, they will be responsible for all unpaid construction, renovation or upgrade debts incurred, and neither Bethany Presbyterian Church nor the Presbytery of Riverside shall be held accountable. Also moved to authorize PFIFD to review and approve the contract on behalf of Presbytery of Riverside. See Appendix 3. **MSP**

Board of Pensions, Church Consultant

Kristin Leucht

Ms. Leucht introduced herself as the new Board of Pensions representative to this area. She comes from the San Fernando Presbytery where she was a long-time Associate Pastor at the La Canada Presbyterian Church. She stated that she would be present through lunch to answer any questions or receive recommendations.

New Worshipping Communities Administrative Commission

Wayne Morrow (CC)

Wayne reported that new groups in the LGBTQ community are receiving funds as a new worshiping community. (Appendix 4E is a report by Nathan Sobers about the Stonewall Ministries, which is a new worshiping community in the Coachella Valley reaching out to the LGBTQ community. They will be applying for a \$25,000 investment grant from 1001 New Worshiping Communities and will begin the process to become a validated ministry of Riverside Presbytery.)

In addition, Appendix 4A is the 2019 Annual Report of Athlete Life which is a sports-based new community of faith. This Brazilian style youth soccer ministry is led and coached by Lazaro Silva under the sponsorship of Northkirk Presbyterian Church in Rancho Cucamonga. It was created through a NWC seed grant submitted to Riverside Presbytery in October, 2018 and approved by Louisville in August 2019.

Appendix 4B is a report regarding Palm Springs Korean Presbyterian Church. In Yang has been the Organizing Pastor for this new worshipping community, but he plans to retire from active ministry. Therefore, the church must find new pastoral leadership after February. The church is in prayer about what will happen next as they try to remake themselves and seek a new pastor.

Transformational Multicultural Fellowship is meeting in the Apple Valley. James Munyi and Joyce Moyangi have been running a "gas station ministry;" however, it is not certain what will happen when they retire to their native Kenya.

All attendees were asked about what is new that they are doing to glorify God.

TWO-MINUTE ANNOUNCEMENT TIME:

TE Sandy Tice reported that her congregation applied for and received a Renewal Grant from Christian Theological Seminary funded through the Lilly Endowment.

TE Mark Hong, Synod Executive Clergy, reported that the Synod will be conducting new GA commissioner orientation for all newly elected commissioners.

TE Ralph Mueller of Ridgecrest reported that a large family left the church because it didn't speak English. This concerned him and he would like to coordinate with the Korean church about making use of space. There was a joint worship service and lunch and the woman decided it was wonderful. Real change can take longer but when it happens it is extraordinary. He decided they could have language classes, including Korean. He believes it is important to love one another even in tension. God moves to recognize the unfamiliar among us.

TE Erin Thomas is the Moderator of SMART Team (Sexual Misconduct Response Team). Training was will be helf the following Wednesday. The Commission is tweaking the policy to address changes in the world. The training is currently offered only once a year. If it was missed, you have to find another training source to be in compliance. The Commission has recently received two new members and could use more. Inquirers and candidates are also responsible for being trained. The presbytery was reminded that elders, deacons and church staff are mandatory reporters.

HPCC made a motion for Bruce Myer to introduce himself. He has come back to Presbytery. He stated he is happy to participate in Presbytery. He served as interim Pastor in Woodland Hills and San Fernando Presbytery.

Nomination for SMART Team : Nominates TE Steve Schulenberger & RE Nathan Sobers, **MSP**

HPCC thanked Christine Dickerson for her service to the Church & Presbytery. She is the Palm Springs Presbyterian Pastor who is retiring from ministry.

Committee on Representation

Wilson Kayange from Redlands First discussed inclusiveness and representation. He urged those present to focus on the big picture which is sharing the love of Christ. He discussed the rotational basis of Presbytery and committees and the need to look at the giftedness of people. Presbytery exhibits inclusiveness through gender, age, race, etc. The question in 2020 is, "Are these enough?". Now we also have to consider political, social, sexual orientation, etc.

Personnel Committee Jeff Mague, (CC)

Appendix 6 provided for information the following: The resignation of Kevin Bowers as Presbytery Communicator was accepted, and he was thanked for his very skillful work and selfless dedication over the last year. The committee is now investigating whether this function would be better served by an outside contractor. The Committee is making arrangements to revamp the Presbytery website and remove redundancy in document storage. The Committee has received approval to hire a part-time bookkeeper at 10 hours per week.

Commission on Preparation for Ministry

John Garten-Shuman, (CC)

John introduced Ashley Childress who had satisfactorily completed all requirements and received the endorsement of Grace Presbyterian Church, Temecula

Ashley was asked to speak briefly about herself and her calling. She stated that she was blessed to move to California from Akron, OH. At the time, she knew no one in Twentynine Palms, and her husband was deployed. Her dog, Nazareth, was her family. She was under the care of Church of the Desert & interned with Wayne Morrow at Desert Hills. Her daughter, Cosette, is now two, and she has been in Temecula about two years. Her husband will be receiving new orders in six to nine months. After four years, she now considers this her home. Julie Hodges asked about her background in education. She stated she attended Ashland Theological in Ohio for ministry and chaplaincy and completed both. We believe that we can be enriched by, rather than reject those of other faiths. Her focus is on love. She has a Bachelors degree in youth development, with a child psychology base, from Kent State University. She feels that God called her to chaplaincy rather than psychology. Her Call – often as a whisper – was to be at seminary. Noel Anderson, Upland, affirmed that Ashley's

statement of faith was articulate and thorough. He pointed to the next to last paragraph where she stated that she has learned self-awareness, She recognizes that she can only control herself and her relationship with God. She cannot carry others' burdens.

After Ashley stepped out of the room, there was a motion from the Commission to advance her from Inquirer to Candidate. **MSP** Ashley returned, and a prayer was offered.

Nominations Committee—Election of Commissioners to General Assembly and Other Business

Susan Skoglund (CC)

Minister of Word & Sacrament nominees:

For Commissioner:

Neal Neuenschwander – called to be Minister of the Word & Sacrament, this would be his 2nd time as Commissioner and he would work for consensus. (Vote: 17)

Nancy Richmond – she could contribute to General Assembly, but could also bring information back to the church & Presbytery and have a connection. She has experience as an attorney that would help in going through documents and knowing what is expected. (Vote 17)

In Yang – He has thirty years of experience as a Minister of the Word & Sacrament and now retirement from active ministry, God has inspired him to serve in this way. (Vote 26)

Due to a tie in second place votes, the alternate MWS Commissioner will be discussed at the next Presbytery Commission and a recommendation brought to the March Assembly.

Ruler Elder Nominees:

Ruling Elder: Cherylynn Thornton from Magnolia, Riverside – In the 1990's she was a presbytery commissioner for 8 years. She attended this church since she was a child, and has been a Deacon, an Elder, and attended Holy Currencies training in Los Angeles. She would like to be delegate to discern God's will for the church. (Vote 45)

Ruling Elder: Eric Wolf of Upland said that God has put eternity in our hearts, but we can't fathom all He is doing. Eric served in the Armed Forces as a Marine. (Vote 14)

YAAD Nominee:

Christopher Stanley of Lake Arrowhead He is currently away at Union Theological Seminary in New York. His father, Bill Stanley, read his statement. Christopher grew up in Lake Arrowhead PC & was a youth leader and camp leader at Big Bear.

Other Business: Other nominations were listed on Appendix 7. Additions to that document included adding Bruce Myers and Carol Stanley to the Partners in Ministry Class of 2022, years 1-3; and adding RE Melodee Kistner Rev. Martin Smith to the Synod Commissioners, Class of 2022, effective January 1, 2020.

Report of the Presbytery Leader for Mission and Vision

Lee Ireland, Temp. PL

At times, Lee feels like a juggler keeping a lot of balls in the air. Pastor to Pastors in the as well as the Pastor at Cathedral City.

He has spent 10 years in ministry. Previously, he was a degreed librarian who went from behind desk to manager of a five-library system. He got his MBA and worked with library automation systems. The last few months he attended committee and commission meetings. Often attending two or more in different areas in the same day. He has worked with Hemet to call a pastor due to Anne Smith's passing. He checks a lot of references for candidates. Big Bear will be having an interim with the retirement of their pastor. Managing personnel takes up a considerable amount of his time.

VCI has been a priority for him. There are twenty-three pastors in this Presbytery involved in VCI. He attends Synod meetings to represent the Presbytery's interests. He has gotten to know colleagues at other Presbyteries. He has attended a large gathering in of clergy in Baltimore, and a clergy retreat in Oak Glen with eighteen churches represented. The retreat resulted in deep conversations about ministry and also allowed an opportunity to relax and have fun. This is an important time for pastors in the Presbytery to get together. Lee believes that a strong network of ruling elders is important. He hopes he can find ways to encourage that cross-fertilization.

Athlete Life 2019 Annual Report

Athlete Life is a sports-based new community of faith, sponsored by Northkirk Presbyterian Church, 9101 19th St., Rancho Cucamonga, CA 91701. Lazaro Silva is the worship community leader and coach of this soccer ministry.

In February, Jeanie Riggs submitted a New Worshipping Communities grant proposal to PIM requesting \$2,000.00 for Athlete Life. The grant was approved 2/21/2019 and received 3/23/2019. This funding front-ended the project enabling him to extend his sports ministry past March, 2019, among this multi-cultural, multi-racial, & multi-denominational youth group.

Additional sporting equipment could be purchased.

A seed grant was filled out and brought to the Riverside Presbytery office in October, 2018 to be signed by the Presbytery Leader and forwarded on to Louisville. In December, 2018, Pastor Martin Smith spoke with Sean Chow, our Western Region

representative for NWC in Louisville. Sean Chow told Pastor Martin Smith they had not reviewed applications since October but hoped to have decisions made in February. On February 28, 2019 when Pastor Martin Smith spoke with Sean Chow, he was advised that Louisville had no application for Lazaro/Athlete

Life. The misplaced or lost document was found and in August, 2019, the seed grant was approved. Now that the \$7500.00 NWC seed grant is available, new plans for Athlete Life are underway.

Pastor Martin Smith, Lazaro Silva, and Jeanie Riggs have been meeting monthly since September reviewing Athlete Life's planning.

Lazaro Silva will tentatively target a launch date of Friday, 11/15 at 3:30-5:00 and Saturday, 11/16 at 10:00-11:30. He has drawn up a logo for Athlete Life and when a field is procured, flyers will be distributed. One specific area he would like to target is youth around the Sunset Heights Section 8 apartment complex at the corner of Haven Avenue and Lemon Avenue in Rancho Cucamonga.

Athlete Life will focus on teaching Brazilian style youth soccer skills, not on building a soccer team. Skills taught over the months will include ball control, dribbling, passing, play vision, and situation awareness.

It is Lazaro Silva's wish to find a business to sponsor his ministry and purchase uniforms (approximately \$1,000.00 for 20 uniforms). He wants participants to wear Athlete Life uniforms (shorts and shirts) with colors of yellow, green and blue.

Lazaro Silva would like to invite two assistants for Athlete Life as volunteers. To show appreciation for his volunteers, he would like to budget to give them gift cards of \$25.00 every two weeks.

The format of Athlete Life will begin with a time of interaction to establish relationships between participants. After this introductory time, Lazaro Silva will open with a gospel story to teach about God's values.

While Lazaro Silva is working with the children, he would like to have a parallel learning activity for parents attending. This activity will center on useful parenting skills or information valuable to them.

This past year the ministry has been regularly touching the lives of three to four youth and their families on a weekly basis

Annual Report Transformational Multicultural Fellowship: Nov. 2019

TMF celebrated 7 years of fellowship, outreach and mission work this July. We describe ourselves as a 'Filling Station', people coming through the 'station' to have spiritual gas. Worship services are held on Sundays from 10.30 am -12.15 pm. We partake of the Lord's Supper every Sunday. Currently we have four families with a total of 8 in average attendance. We have a low budget of \$7,500 for the next year. The critical aspect of our budget is the weekly lease of \$75.00 for the Chamber Conference room for our worship services. For the newer members of the AC for NWC you may not be aware that both leaders - Rev. James Munyi and Lay Pastor Joyce Mwangi are tent-makers. We are full time Chaplains. James tried to cut some hours from the hospital to spend more quantity time for the Fellowship, but that did not go well.

Unlike a congregation format in organization and leadership, James and Joyce are the pastors, the elders the leaders, the cleaners. We give, count, bank and write checks as necessary. While we tithe and teach on giving, most of the three families are low income. Our younger members benefit from camp sponsorship from the Presbytery of which we are very thankful. We have received financial support in the past from the Presbytery that helped us pay the rent and stationary and do some mission support. Our application for Investment grant in 2016/17 was not successful. Our resent application for \$11,000 grant from the presbytery has not been responded to. We have supported Tumaini Children's orphanage in Riamukurwe Parish over the years. We continue hosting Grief Recovery completion classes quarterly. All our 3 past Presbytery Leaders have had an opportunity to visit with us. We want to extend an invitation to the AC to worship with us on December 1st when we shall bless those who have completed Grief class at our hospital. A representative is most welcome.

Both of us plan to retire in the near future and we have put our house on sale. For the continuation of a ministry here in Apple Valley, a residential property is important, we think. Would the Presbytery be interested in purchasing this house for future mission workers here? Would the AC support the idea?

She shared the history that PW has in the women's and civil rights movements, her visits to the Susan B. Anthony home and Harriet Tubman House and the hospitality shown by many PWC's. The Gathering also installed a new PWC Coordinating Team and dedicated the Thank Offering.

<u>San Bernardino PWC</u>: PWC's Fall Gathering will be held on November 4th. They will dedicate their Thank Offering and keynote speaker will be Rev. Dr. Sandy Tice.

Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Riverside produced their current Directory of active Presbyterian Women in the Congregations. Acting faithfully to care for God's creation, Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery are supporting the creation of the Vine Street Community Park (First Presbyterian Church of Redlands). In collaboration with PW in the PC(USA)'s Eco-justice Initiative and with donations from our PWC's, we will help plant a tree in this community project.

4. Two Shared Grant requests were sent to the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions. They were for in home care for a spouse of an Honorably Retired minister member and an Honorably Retired minister member.
